

50 Arts Commissions



The Hewlett Foundation's new Hewlett 50 Arts Commissions will provide grants to 10 local nonprofit organizations, \$150,000 each to commission significant new works of theater, spoken word and musical theater and premiere them in the Bay Area.

Applicants for the 2018 awards must be nonprofit organizations with 501(c)(3) public charity status based in one of the 11 Bay Area counties (Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Monterey, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Solano, or Sonoma), but they do not need to be focused on the arts as part of their primary mission.
