Day of Community Insights & Collaboration: 4th Annual Arts Education Summit



On April 28th, the Arts Council for Monterey County held the 4th Annual Arts Education Summit focused on "Arts and Healing: Model Programs & Practices".

Over seventy community members joined together to learn about local area non-profits, government agencies, medical facilities, and arts organizations that incorporate art classes and experiences for their constituents. The engaging panelists and featured guests represented the range of Monterey County arts and healing resources. The keynote address by Jamila Dunn, Director of Education, of the Kala

Institute of San Francisco focused on "The Power of Process" with a hands-on Blind Contour Drawing, the impact of sensory inclusion and how to create art projects that include all social emotional learners.

"It's amazing and very powerful to see that art is a driving force that results in the healing of our community. Its impact goes a long way to those that receive the services that each organization provides, bringing richness, better health, and togetherness resulting in a stronger more creative tight-knit community," said Elgene Tumacder, Arts Council Teaching Artist.


