

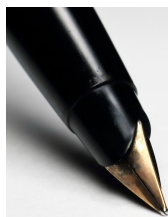
## Get to know Artist Jennifer Colby
