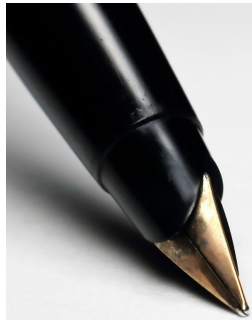
Get to know Artist Carol Marshall

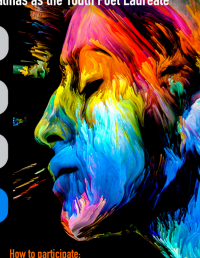
Share your best and most inspiring original poems to represent Salinas as the Youth Poet Laureate.
